Who We Are



LA Best Babies Network (LABBN) is a community benefit of Dignity Health — California Hospital Medical Center in Los Angeles. LABBN brings together hospitals and community organizations in Los Angeles County, providing tools and training to make their home visiting programs succeed. With our coordination and technical support, these programs are changing lives during pregnancy and beyond.



The Los Angeles County Perinatal and Early Childhood Home Visitation Consortium is an alliance of over 50 home visiting agencies and maternal and child health organizations. Overseen and managed by LA Best Babies Network, the Consortium shares training and educational resources, researches best practices, supports enhanced referral systems between programs, researches and collects data on home visiting outcomes, and advocates for systems and policies that recognize the value of home visiting.

What Is Home Visiting?









Voluntary and free for pregnant people and families with young children (0-5 years old)

Ongoing, personalized health and parenting support from trained professionals

Connections to community resources and services

(e.g., healthy pregnancy,

Eligibility requirements (e.g., pregnancy stage or youngest child's age)







Program delivery mode (e.g., in-person visits or virtual sessions)



Program duration (i.e., how long someone can participate)

What is the eDirectory?

An online tool that helps connect those who are pregnant or who have young children (ages 0-5) with free home visiting and doula services in L.A. County.

How many programs are in the eDirectory?

It includes 35+ community organizations and hospitals in L.A. County that use a total of nine different home visiting models to provide support to families. Three doula programs are also included.

Who should use it?

- Families: Pregnant people or those with young kids who want free home visiting support and/or a doula
- Health/service providers who want to help someone find home visiting and doula services

How does a user know which programs are available?

By answering a few questions about the person they're referring. The eDirectory will sort out eligibility and show all available programs.
