


REFERRALS WORKGROUP

Accomplishemnts

- Hosted a Housing Resources Panel webinar on July 11th with 147 participants joining the webinar.
- Disseminated their biannual Barriers to Accessing Resource Services for Families Prenatal to Age 5 survey.
- Invited speakers from several agencies to join workgroup meetings to talk about their programs and referral processes, including Help Me Grow, CCRC, DMH and USC Telehealth.
- Partnered with Advocacy workgroup to discuss how to increase referrals into home visiting programs.

Our goal was to partner with housing agencies and provide home visiting staff with tools, contacts and strategies to improve housing referrals and support families in crisis.












OUTREACH PROGRAM NTEGRATED CAR



FATHER ENGAGEMENT WORKGROUP

Accomplishemnts

- Created two documents with engagement recommendations for home-visiting managers/directors and direct service providers (with Spanish translations).
- Supported and promoted the monthly Father Engagement Reflective Drop-In Group.
- Partnered with the Department of Mental Health for a Birth to 5
 Collaborative Workshop, "Building Relationships with Dads: A
 Necessary Step to Promote Family & Paternal Wellbeing" webinar
 with 244 people registered so far.






AFRICAN AMERICAN HOME VISITING ENGAGEMENT WORKGROUP

Accomplishments

- Planned for the 4th Annual Home Visiting Day.
- Workgroup members attended a Meet Your Village doula event to promote home visiting in March.
- Held two Communities of Practice groups for home visiting staff, and planning for four more in the next fiscal year.





ADVOCACY WORKGROUP

Accomplishemnts

- Followed several local and statewide initiatives and legislative work, including Paid Family Leave, Birthing Care Pathway, the Mandated Supporter shift, and Proposition 1.
- Planned for the 4th Annual Home Visiting Day.
- Partnered with Alliance for Justice to host an Advocacy Webinar called "How your Organization can Influence Policy for the Greater Good."
- Partnered with Western Center on Law and Poverty to host a "Demystifying Home Visiting for Legal Aid, Food Banks, and Community Partners" webinar.
- Exploring advocacy opportunities to partner with DPSS and CalWORKs to increase referrals into their home visiting program.




DATA WORKGROUP

BEST PRACTICES WORKGROUP

Accomplishemnts

- Published the 2025 Annual Training Survey in February.
- Training survey infographic created by Policy Team and approved by the workgroup.
- Hosted 2 3-part training webinars based on Training Survey findings (Domestic Violence; Immigrant Rights) in October, November and December.
 - 3-Part Domestic Violence Webinar Attendance: 421 people!
 - 3-Part Immigrant Rights Webinar Attendance: 612 people!
- Hosted a follow-up webinar on Immigrant Rights based on feedback from attendees.
 - o Immigrant Rights Follow-Up Webinar Attendance: 261 people!
- Created a Training Resource Crosswalk document to highlight the needs identified in the Annual Training Survey and which resources already exist to address those needs.








