










6 WEEK POSTPARTUM CHECKUP




Child received at least 1 developmental screening in the past year



STORY: COMMUNITY REFERRALS

Our bilingual Family Support Specialist working with mostly the immigrant community, were able to provide education and support to those families affected by the new administration. FSS were able to download, print and distribute several Red Cards to help these families assert their rights and defend themselves in many situations, such as when ICE agents go out to their homes. FSS also referred several families to "Know Your Rights Workshops Community Immigration Rights," through their local Community Resource Center (CRC).
